New pets:



The arrival of a new puppy, kitten or rabbit in the family is an exciting time. Naturally everyone wants the very best for their tiny pet. Why not bring your pet in to the nurses' clinic for a pre-vaccination

visit. It is a good chance to introduce your new pet to the practice and to ask any of those little questions about basic care of puppies, kittens or rabbits. The nurses will be pleased to offer advice on the importance of diet, insurance, flea and worm control, and early training.

The adolescent check-up:

Extra help:

Our nurses also run special clinics to help your senior or diabetic pet enjoy a full and happy life.

The weight clinic:

If your pet is overweight, he or she may be at an increased risk of several clinical problems such as:

- ⇒ *Diabetes*
- ⇒ *Heart disease*
- ⇒ *Arthritis*
- ⇒ *Breathing difficulties*



The nurses are happy to weigh your pet and advise on a diet which will not only have your pet looking his/her best, but also feeling his/her best too. Achieving his/her ideal weight may even increase your pet's life expectancy!

Dental hygiene:

Research indicates that over 70% of dogs and cats show signs of gum disease by the age of 5. Bad breath can be offensive and gum disease can lead to tooth loss and serious medical problems. Good dental care for your pet requires a three step programme:

- ✓ *A professional examination*
- ✓ *Home care and a good diet*
- ✓ *Regular brushing*
- ✓ *Regular check-ups*

Fleas and worms:
